What is a Bulk Transportation Carrier?

This refers to a vehicle or vessel capable of transporting 2000 litres of petroleum and petroleum products.
These vehicles include: trucks, road tanker wagons, fuel barges and boats.

the vehicle.



Guidelines for Applying



Transporting petroleum and petroleum products without a licence is ILLEGAL.

For purposes of safety and to ensure legality in the transport of petroleum and petroleum products, have your bulk transportation carrier Licensed!



- 1) Obtain/Uplift an Application Form from the GEA Licensing Office at 295 Quamina Street OR download one from our website: www.gea.gov.gy
- 2) Fill the Application Form, including all relevant information in the spaces provided.

If you are unsure of the requirements, do not hesitate to ask any member of the Licensing Staff.

- 3) Attach the following documents to the application:
 - a) Form of Identification: passport or identification card and, in the case of a non-Caricom national, permanent residence permit or valid work permit
 - b) Business registration or incorporation documents, providing registration is trading under business name.
 - c) If not a first time applicant, a tax compliance certificate [or tax receipts].
 - d) Police clearance certificate



For Vehicles, provide a copy of:-

- Motor Vehicle Registration (only first time applicants)
- Fitness
- Motor Vehicle Licence
- Insurance
- Driver's Licence for all drivers
- Two coloured photographs of vehicle showing the front and side of the vehicle

For Vessels provide a copy of:-

- Vessel Registration (only first time applicants)
- Captain's Licence for all captains
- Certificate of Inspection from Maritime Administration Department
- Certificate of Inspection from the Guyana Fire Service, if applicable
- Two coloured photographs of vessel showing the front and side of the vessel

ALL VEHICLES/VESSELS
MUST HAVE:

'NO SMOKING' and
'HIGHLY FLAMMABLE'
signs on the sides and
back respectively in 4
inches thickness lettering
size and an ABC dry
powder extinguisher
onboard at all times.
